

Lysaght the Musical Creating a Virtual Ensemble Recording

<u>Audio</u>

- Always Use Headphones! The best way to record is to have the track playing on another device (another phone/laptop/tablet), using headphones with this device and then recording the video on another device. I.e. having the track playing through a laptop with headphones and then recording on your mobile phones video camera.
- Avoid recording in a noisy area where possible. Try take make sure the room you are performing in does not have any fans or heaters on. We want to make sure we only hear the sound of your voice/instrument.
- Have a run through first and make sure that when you listen back to the audio in the video you have recorded this sounds as clear as possible. If the audio sounds muffled/ distorted, try moving your camera/smartphone further away, or if the audio isn't very loud, try moving your camera/smartphone closer to you.

Recording The Video!

- Clean the Camera Lens! Before you shoot any video with your smartphone or camera, give the lens a quick clean to free up any possible smudges.
- Check Your Settings & Resolution! Most Smartphones have several different resolution settings available be sure to record in the highest possible resolution.
 1080p/4k is best wherever this is possible. Android phones usually have three dots in the top left corner of the camera app where you can check this, Apple go to the 'Camera' option in the main Settings App to change this.
- Film in Landscape!
- Well lit area where possible, make sure that there is adequate light on your face so we can see you clearly in the video!
- Steady the Camera whether you have someone holding the camera for you, or if you have something you can prop your smartphone up against.
